#### Social and Algorithmic Forces in Agenda Curation

Social media has transformed the way we determine which public issues reach general interest. Not only have they allowed the audience for topics that were once marginal or minor to be maximized, but they have also opened up avenues for manipulating public opinion through information campaigns. What we see on digital networks is a selection of content resulting from the complex interaction between social and algorithmic curation. In this talk, I will discuss recent empirical research that seeks to unpack this complexity and offer data to help rethink how we govern and regulate the digital public space
